

<p>MATHS</p>	<p>Watch</p> <p>Can you name the months of the year?</p> <p>Months of the year songs https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=5enDRrWyXaw</p>  <p>https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=v608v42dKeI</p> 	<p>Play</p>  <p>Why not create a calendar?</p> <p>You could draw a picture for each month or perhaps draw a picture to show each season; Spring, Summer, Autumn and Winter.</p> <p>Now, add special dates. For example, when is your birthday?</p>

<p>PHONICS</p>	<p>Watch and practise saying the sounds. https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=aNcBWSBxSp0</p>  <p>Sing along with the tricky word song. https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=TvMyssfAUx0</p> 	<p>Today, we are going to play tricky word hide and seek.</p> <p>Ask your grown up to hide the tricky words that you wrote out yesterday all over the house or your garden. Count how many you have in total before you hide them.</p> <p>Now, you need to try to find all the tricky words. When you find each one you need to read it and then say a sentence with it in like this:</p> <p>the - The cat sat on the mat.</p>  <p>How did you do? Maybe you could write down some of your sentences? Don't forget to use a capital letter, finger spaces and a full stop.</p>


READING
