
Suggestions for activities at home

Splash!

This week we are carrying on with our splash theme, specifically looking at how we can travel in different ways across water.

Monday

Watch the video of Who sank the boat?




Have you ever been on a boat or seen a boat? What did it look like? What did it feel like to be on a boat? Can you think of any other ways to travel across water? E.g. hovercraft, ferry, jet ski.

Draw a picture of a boat.

Maths

Practise recognising and writing numbers. We use the following formation (how we write them) for the numbers:



Please encourage your children to write their numbers in this way, starting at the red dot. Please note that we use a straight line for number one, a seven without a line through it, and a number nine with a straight line down.

Tuesday

Have a go at using junk modelling to make a boat. What material would work best to help your boat to float? Try your boat and see if it floats. If it does float, can you put some characters in your boat and take them on an adventure? How many can you fit in?

If your boat doesn't float, can you adapt it to make it float?

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Maths

Practise recognising and writing numbers. We use the following formation (how we write them) for the numbers:

Write numbers on a piece of paper and then cut them up and put them back again in the correct order, you could try 1-5, 1-10 or 1-20 for a challenge.



Wednesday

Floating and sinking

Get a large tub of water and put different objects in it, to see which one floats and which one sinks. Ask your child if they notice any similarities or differences in the objects that float and sink.




Maths

Have a go at the summer themed dot to dots.

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
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Thursday

Watch the video of Lost and Found

Discuss what you would take with you on a trip to the south pole. Can you draw in the suitcase template what you would take?



Maths

We are going to practise combining 2 groups of objects to work out the total. Write numbers 1 - 5 on small pieces of paper and put in a bag. Pull out one number and collect that number of objects from a group of objects. You can use anything that you have lots of. Now pull out a different number and count that many. Now combine the 2 groups and count how many you have altogether.



Friday

Have a go at making a penguin, you could cut it out and stick a lolly stick on the back to make it into a story puppet. Can you use your puppet to tell a story? Maybe you will take the penguin home like in lost and found. What would you see along the way? You could make other characters to add into your story.

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Maths

We are going to carry on practising combining 2 groups of objects to work out the total. You will need a dice or a spinner. You can make a spinner using one of the templates and add a paper clip into the middle, so you can see which number it lands on. You will also need some different objects, it could be beads, Lego pieces or socks, anything you have a few of.

See which number your dice or spinner lands on and count that many out of the group. Repeat and then add up how many objects you have altogether.



Phonics- through the week

This week we are going to focus on rhyming.

There is rhyming words in Who sank the boat? Ask your child if they can think of anymore to add to the rhyming string.

Silly soup

Have a go at playing silly soup. You need a bowl and spoon. You sing or say the words,

We're going to make silly soup,
We're making soup that's silly,
We're going to put it in the fridge,
To make it nice and chilly.

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And then you add rhyming objects or pictures to your bowl. For example, bee and key. You could cut out the printable pictures or make your own. Add as many as you can to your rhyming string.

Rhyming strings

Take it in turns to add a rhyming word to a string. It doesn't matter if the words aren't real, that is part of the fun of rhyming! For example:

Hat
Bat
Mat
Cat
Lat
Dat
Gnat
Sat
Pat

Rhyming words worksheet

Have a go at the rhyming words worksheet, you could draw a line to match the pairs or cut the pictures out and play pairs.

Other

Father's Day Cards

It is Father's Day on Sunday. Make a card for your dad or someone who you live with to thank them for everything that they do for you.
