What we will be doing in school

English - Commotion in the Ocean

This week the children will be reading poems based on animals found in the oceans! They will be interpreting poems and trying to guess what animal the poem is about, practicing their listening skills through drawing an animal from a description and trying to figure out what it is, as well as looking at different types of poetry. We will be looking at shape poems, acrostic poems and rhyming poems. The children will learn about similes and alliteration and try to use these in their own poems that they write!


How you can help at home

Maths - Addition and subtraction

This week the children will be revising addition and subtraction with a focus on number bonds within 10. We will start off the week with adding by making ten first. Children will have visuals to see that $6 + 7$ is the same as $10 + 3$. This task will really focus on their knowledge of number bonds to 10. If the number sentence starts with 6 what else do I need to get to 10? 4. The children will then use the 4 from the 7 and then add the 3.

Example: $6 + 7 = 6 + 4 + 3 = 10 + 3 = 13$.

We will then look at subtraction with and without crossing 10. The children will learn how to draw Base 10 which will put them in good stead for starting Year 2. By the end of the week children will be looking at different number related facts. This will also test their knowledge of number bonds and show them patterns of adding bigger numbers as well as recapping their understanding of number bonds to 20. E.g. If I know $1 + 9 = 10$ I know that $9 + 1 = 10$ I also know $10 - 9 = 1$ and $10 - 1 = 9$. And if I know $11 + 4 = 15$ I know that $4 + 11 = 15$ as well as $15 - 11 = 4$ and $15 - 4 = 11$.

Keep practicing number bonds to 10. Show the children that addition is commutative and that addition number sentences can be written either way.

$$1 + 9 = 10$$

$$9 + 1 = 10$$


Click on the green circle (Number bonds) then the children can have a go at both the number bonds to 10 section and number bonds to 20 section.

Science - Materials

This week the children will be introduced to their new science topic - materials. We will start off by discussing what a material is, look at man-made and natural materials and look at the properties of the materials.

Have a look at what materials you can find around your house and surrounding area. Can you write a list of all the materials you find?



Art - Golden Hinde in a Bottle

The children will be working on the next stage of their mixed media Golden Hinde in a bottle picture. They will be creating their bottle shape by cutting out the outline from their wonderful skyline pictures they created. They will then create the cork stop for the top of the bottle ready for the assembling stage in week 5.

Have you got a cork at home? Let your child have a look at it and see the detail of the cork. Perhaps you would like to do a little research on where cork comes from!

Geography

This week the children will identify where animals come from around the world. Over the past couple of weeks the children have been looking at James Cook and his voyages on the Endeavour. On board was a naturalist and botanist called Joseph Banks. The children have been imagining what it would have been like discovering a new species for the first time just like Joseph Banks when he first spotted a kangaroo.

If you have an atlas or a map at home perhaps you can look at this together and identify different countries. Maybe you have links or connections with friends and family in other parts of the world and can find these countries on a map together. Google Earth is also a fantastic resource to use if you don't have one at home!

The children will be looking at a world map and identify which animals are found in those countries/continents.

Phonics

We will be looking at some digraphs that the majority of children found difficult, revising those by spotting them in words and writing words with them in.
