What we will be doing in school	How you can help at home
<p><b><u>Topic -Super Me, Super You!</u></b></p> <p>Next week, we will finish our half term by thinking about how we will welcome a new member to our class- a very special bear! This will include a trip to the local post-box, as we will be posting letters to the special bear...!</p> 	<p>Talk to your children about their address, road name, neighbours and favourite local places you can walk to. You could draw a simple map of their route to school or to the park. Perhaps your child could write a letter for a friend who lives nearby. What is their address? Can you post it through their letterbox?</p>
<p><b><u>Maths</u></b></p> <p>We will be learning about repeating patterns this week. We will use shapes, objects and sequences of clapping and tapping to make different patterns that the children can remember and then repeat.</p> 	<p>You can help your child at home by asking them to repeat a pattern after you e.g. clap, clap, tap, clap, clap, tap with your hands.</p> <p>Ask your child to put some objects in a patterned sequence. Can they do it with two, three or four different objects but following the same sequence of patterns?</p>

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
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### Phonics and tricky words

#### The new sound is: j

We will be practising hearing and saying the sounds in words (segmenting) using the sounds we have learnt so far. e.g. 'dug' and begin to say sounds and blend to read words.

Sounds taught so far: c, o, a, d, g, f, s, e, l, i, t and u.



Play alternative 'I Spy' game for sounds in a word, e.g. "I Spy with my little eye, something that sounds like h-a-t" - can they guess what the word is that you spy? Can they try it themselves, breaking words into the smallest sounds?

e.g. "I Spy a r-u-g"; "I Spy a f-or-k".
