What we will be doing in school	How you can help at home
<p style="text-align: center;"><u>Topic - We're Going on a Bear Hunt</u></p> <p>Next week, we are going to be reading the story 'We're Going on a Bear Hunt' and learning to retell it through re-enacting it, and making story maps.</p> <div style="text-align: center;">  <p><i>We're Going on a Bear Hunt</i></p> </div>	<p>As we will be using describing words, e.g. 'thick oozy mud', you can encourage children to use describing words, perhaps in a guessing game. For example, 'my toy is smooth and round, what is it?' for a ball, 'my toy is soft and furry, what is it?' for a teddy. What can they describe when you are out and about? For example, "I am stamping in the crunchy crispy leaves".</p>
<p style="text-align: center;"><u>Maths</u></p> <p>We will be working on positional language including over, under, above, below, on top, underneath, next to, in front of, behind and in between.</p> <div style="text-align: center;">  </div>	<p>Go on a hunt around the house, garden or park - ask your child to describe the place you have hidden something, e.g. it is on the chair, it is behind the sofa, it is under the table, it is in between the armchair and the sofa? Can they follow your instructions to find it? Can they also hide something for you to find and describe where it is hidden?</p>

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Phonics


New sounds: p, h and b

New tricky words: he and she.

We will be practising hearing and saying the sounds in words (segmenting) using the sounds we have learnt so far, e.g. 'hat' or 'bag' and begin to say sounds and blend to read words.

Sounds taught so far: c, o, a, d, g, f, s, e, l,
i, t, u, y, j, r, n, m,

Tricky words taught so far: the, I, to, go
no and into.



Write words on pieces of paper. Hide them around the room. Challenge your child to find the words and help them to read them. Can they write some words for you to find and read?

Look for tricky words on signs and posters when you are out with your child. How many can your child spot?

Additional learning
