<b>MATHS</b>	<p>This week, we will learn about measures. What could you do? What did you notice? Can you explain?</p>	<p>You will need   and </p> <p>Draw around your foot and cut it out. Ask your grown-ups for help if needed.</p> <p>Now go and explore!</p> <p>Go around your home and find out which objects are longer or shorter than your foot. What did you find out?</p> <p><b>Challenge</b> How could you show what you found out? Perhaps you could draw the objects in order of length or write a list of the objects in order from the shortest to the longest object.</p>

What would you need to take if you were going to the moon in a rocket? Have a chat with your grown up about what might be on your list.</p> <p>Can you make a list of what you might take? It might include:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Your favourite food</li> <li>• Your special toy</li> <li>• Your favourite book</li> <li>• Some photo's of your family.</li> </ul> <p>Don't forget to number your list.</p> <p><b>Challenge</b> Can you write a sentence about where you would go to in your rocket? For example, My rocket is going to Mars.</p>
