

For example, shapes or stickers.</p>  <p>Challenge Create your own pattern for your grown-ups to continue. You could use soft toys, action figures, Lego or cushions.</p>
<p>PHONICS</p>	<p>Watch Miss Burr's high frequency words (key words) video. High frequency words are words which often appear in written texts. 		<p>Challenge You could write some of the words in your exercise book. You could write a sentence which includes a high frequency word. For example, The dog is big.</p>
<p>TOPIC ON THE MOVE</p>	<p>Watch Mrs Micklethwaite's Different Types of Trains video.</p> <p>Watch Catie's Amazing Machines. Catie looks at a steam train, the Maglev and a tram. https://www.bbc.co.uk/iplayer/episode/b0bp1jrj/caties-amazing-machines-series-1-4-rail-machines</p> 	<p>Which train is your favourite? Do you like trains that go fast? Or trains that can travel up mountains?</p>  <p>Here is an example of a special car design. It has a propeller so that it can fly and a telescope so that it can see things far away. What else does it have? Do cars usually have these things?</p> <p>Now can you design your own train? What does it look like? Can it do something special? Is it super fast?</p> <p>Can you label the special features?</p> <p>Challenge Perhaps you can write a sentence. For example, My train can go super fast.</p>
