

English – Roaring Lions

Write a fact file about Lions.

This week the children are starting their new topic: Go Wild!

We will be looking at Lion's this week, listening to fictional stories, and researching fun facts to create an amazing lion poster!

Teach		Activities
Day One Monday	<p>We would like the children to complete page 70 and 71 in their CGP books.</p> <p>This work is on Information Texts</p> <p>The teach is simple to follow on page 70, but children may need support in reading the words.</p>	<p>- Page 71 to be completed in CGP English books</p>
Day Two Tuesday	<p><u>Listen to the story: Lazy Lion</u></p> <p>Watch the teach video with Mrs Amos</p> <p>Today we will be asking the children to do some research about a lion. They will watch the videos listed and listen carefully to some of the vocabulary being used.</p> <p>The first thing we would like the children to do is fill in the gaps in the fact sentences, with the correct word from the list at the bottom of the sheet.</p>	<p>Fill in the gaps in the sentences</p> <p>https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=qnaXJf_yaj8</p> <p>https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=tlZwYsJpqjo</p> <p>https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=79rxlqT7ePc</p> <p>https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=L5YHIH0f4Uw</p> <p>Challenge: As a challenge the children can write a definition of each of the new words, they have learnt from watching the videos.</p>
Day Three Wednesday	<p><u>Listen to the story: How to hide a lion</u></p> <p>Watch the teach video with Mrs Amos</p>	<p>Today the children can follow the instructions to create a lion's head.</p> <p>It will need to be quite large – so follow the video and instructions careful to get the best shape and size.</p>

	<p>Today the children will be creating a large lions head. This will be the base for tomorrow's lesson where children will be using the mane to write the facts they have found out about lions.</p> <p>You may want to get or use some orange card, but crafting the poster from paint or coloured pens will look just as great!</p>	
<p>Day Four Thursday</p>	<p><u>Listen to the story: Lionheart</u></p> <p>Watch the teach video with Mrs Amos</p> <p>Today the children will be using the fill in the gap sheet, to read through facts about lions. They may also want to write new facts down and watch additional videos about lions to see what else they can find out.</p>	<p>First the children are going to cut some triangular shaped pieces of paper – this will need to be large enough to write one fact on each triangle. They will become part of the mane on the lion head!</p> <p>We think 4-5 facts would be a good amount for the children to write on their triangular mane pieces.</p> <p>They will not be copying the fact, but putting the facts into their own words.</p> <p>EG: Lions can SLEEP for up to 20 hours a day ---> Lions enjoy a lovely long snooze for about 20 hours every day!</p> <p>When the children have finished writing their facts on the different triangle, they could colour them carefully with a pencil and stick them to their lion's mane.</p>
<p>Day Five Friday</p>	<p>Listen to the lion and the mouse story – it is only very short.</p> <p>Have a discussion with your child about the story, what happened? Are the mouse and lion likely friends?</p> <p>Set children up with the appropriate challenge level reading comprehension questions. There is easy, medium and hard. Please check you have the appropriate level.</p>	<p>Lion and the Mouse reading comprehension to be completed.</p> <p>Some children will need additional support reading through the questions and understanding what the question is asking. Eg: matching sentences, ticking a box, writing a response.</p> <p>Please ensure you have given your child a level that suits their reading level.</p>
