

MATHS	<p>This week we are going to explore how to make nine and ten. You can use the frame to explore how to make 9.</p>  <p>You can choose a theme for your ten frame.</p>  <p>Challenge You could make another ten frame to explore numbers up to twenty.</p>

For example: The snail went in a pail and left a trail.</p> 
<p>TOPIC</p> <p>AMAZING EGGS</p>	<p>Our new topic this half term is Amazing Eggs!</p> <p>All sorts of different creatures lay eggs.</p> <p>Watch – Parent input required (Do not touch or eat eggs if you have an allergy to eggs, just watch the film)</p>	<p>Activity – Parent input required You will need your exercise book and a pencil.</p> <p>What would you like to find out about eggs? Would you like to know more about dinosaur eggs? Would you like to know what the clear liquid around the egg yolk is called? Or perhaps you'd like to know why chickens eggs are different colours?</p>

Watch Mrs Micklethwaite read an information book about eggs and take a closer look at an egg and then cook it. **Of course, if you are allergic to eggs don't try this at home, just watch the film!**
If you are not allergic to eggs, you could break one and have a closer look. Perhaps your grown up could help you to cook it to see how it changes?
