Tuesday	Teach	Activities
Phonics	<p>Words of the week: many, people, plant, money, improve.</p> <p>Our focus for this week is to look at the alternative spellings for the 's' sound (phoneme) as it can often appear differently in the written word. In today's lesson we will be looking at the alternative 'se' spelling.</p>  <p>The image shows a slide with a green-to-blue gradient background. Finally, on slide 8, your child will need to sort through the words and put them into the correct columns. You can either print this slide and stick it in or draw your own table straight into their book.</p>

English

Focus:

Pages: 18-21

In this week's English, we will continue to use the **10-minute Weekly Workout (10 MWW)** books to give our brains a warm-up!

Task 1- Today you will complete workouts **9 & 10 (pages 18-21)**. The children should be familiar these questions and should be able to answer them independently but they may still need some support from their adults.

Grammar reminders:

Verbs are referred to as 'doing words', e.g. swim, running, jumping etc)

Past tense means to show that something has previously happened, e.g. **The dog barked at me; the ship sailed away; the mouse ate the cheese.**

Imperative verbs (bossy verbs) are words that are also commands, e.g. stand up, sit down, mix, go, stir etc.

Task 1- This week the children are making Banana Bread with Zara.

First, watch Zara's video clip of how to make banana bread which can be found on the school website. If you do not have the ingredients for banana bread, you may wish to make a different fruit-based cake or pie.

(In school we will be baking with Zara so you are welcome to do the same at home or just join in by watching the video clip).

As you watch this clip, you may want to pause every now and then to take some notes on each important step or to hear the instructions again.

Task 2- You can either:

Open your blue books and write the date at the top of the page and the title of **Banana Bread**

Next, write out all of the ingredients for **banana bread** into your books in a list- don't forget to include the amounts and what equipment you will need. See the example below:

Banana Bread **23rd February 2021**

Equipment

A mixing bowl

A wooden spoon


A bread tin


