



Watch – Parent input required


Watch Mrs Micklethwaite show you how to make a Lego car that can go on its own.

How does the balloon make the car go? When the balloon is blown up it is filled with gas. When you release the balloon the air/gas escapes creating a forward pushing motion called thrust and this makes the car move.
