Wednesday- Easter Bonnet Parade.

Make a bonnet at home and bring it in on the day! Your child can show their creation at school!

What we will be doing in school	How you can help at home
<p style="text-align: center;"><u>Topic</u></p> <p>We will be finding out the answers to any questions we still have about eggs.</p> 	<p>Talk about your child's favourite part of the topic. Was it having the ducklings hatching from eggs at our school? Or the day the dinosaurs came? They have had a go at Palaeontology. Would they like to be a Palaeontologist when they grow up?</p>
<p style="text-align: center;"><u>Maths</u></p> <p>We will explore 3D shape and patterns.</p> 	<p>Look out for patterns in your home in the local area. What does your child notice? You could paint patterns on hard boiled eggs!</p> <p>Play I-Spy with 3D shapes. Take turns with your child.</p>
<p style="text-align: center;"><u>Phonics</u></p> <p>We will continue to recap the sounds and tricky words we have learnt over the past few weeks.</p> <p>Sounds taught so far: c, o, a, d, g, f, s, e, l, i, t, u, y, j, r, n, m, p, h, b, k, v, w, x, z, qu, ll, ss, ff, zz, sh, ch, th, ck, oo, oo, ee, or, ng, ai, oi.</p> <p>Tricky words taught so far: the, to, I, no, go, into, she, he, me, we, be, you, was, my, they, all, are, said, have, come, some.</p>	<p>Look for the sounds spelt with two letters in their reading books, can they say the sound? For example, ch, sh, th and oa. Can they begin to blend sounds to read simple words such as ar-m = arm?</p> <p>Try to spot the tricky words we have taught in books that you are reading. Can they spell them out, for example, with magnetic letters?</p>
