What we will be doing in school	How you can help at home
<p style="text-align: center;"><u>Topic - Dinosaurs</u></p> <p>We will revisit the meaning of herbivore, carnivore and omnivore and we will be writing recipes and menus for dinosaurs. We will be looking at why dinosaurs died out and thinking about what we have learnt about eggs during this half term.</p> 	<p>Talk about different dinosaurs. What can your child tell you about them? Do they have a favourite dinosaur? Why not plan a virtual visit perhaps for the Easter Holiday to the Natural History Museum and learn lots more about your favourite dinosaurs.</p>
<p style="text-align: center;"><u>Maths</u></p> <p>We will revisit subtraction through games and other practical activities.</p> 	<p>Try some practical subtraction at home, e.g. we have 10 apples, if we eat 5 how many will be left?</p>
<p style="text-align: center;"><u>Phonics</u> <u>Recap</u></p> <p>We will continue recap the sounds and tricky words we have learnt over the past few weeks.</p> <p>Sounds taught so far: c, o, a, d, g, f, s, e, l, i, t, u, y, j, r, n, m, p, h, b, k, v, w, x, z, qu, ll, ss, ff, zz, sh, ch, th, ck, oo, oo, ee, or, ng, ai, oi.</p> <p>Tricky words taught so far: the, to, I, no, go, into, she, he, me, we, be, you, was, my, they, all, are, said, have, come, some.</p>	<p>Try to spot tricky words on posters and signs in the local community. You could make it an I-Spy game.</p>
