
Reading longer words

Look for digraphs in the word, e.g. hammer

Look at the syllables in the word, e.g. picnic pic nic

Read 'chunks' of the word, e.g. ticket tick et

Read compound words in sections, e.g. lunchbox <u>lunch</u> <u>box</u>



Reading longer words

Strategies for your child to use as they read longer words

- Pause.
- Read on to find other clues about what the word says.
- Read the sentence again from the beginning.
- Look at the illustrations for clues.
- Which words would make sense here?

High frequency words

Your child will learn to recognise these words as we use them frequently in our writing and speech.

Decodable words: a, an, as, at, and, back, big, but, can, dad, had, get, got, him, his, if, in, is, it, mum, not, on, of, off, up, down, for, look, now, see, that, them, this, then, too, will, with, went, children, it's, just, from, help

Tricky words: the, no, to, into, go, I, all, are, be, he, her, me, my, she, they, was, we, you, put, by, sure, pure, push, pull, full

How to help your child with reading and writing at home 1/2

- Watch the videos on Class Dojo and the school's website.
- Use the tricky words and high frequency words resources (sent home in your child's bag) to support writing.
- Tap in to your child's interests to encourage them to read and write.
- Support your child to be the author of their own stories, : grow the stories together by asking questions about characters and settings.
- Look at different types of texts such as information books, magazines or leaflets.
- Read with your child whenever you can, for example, read a magazine together whilst waiting for an appointment.

How to help your child with reading and writing at home 2/2

- Read books with rhymes and repeated words or phrases.
- Ask your child questions, for example, What do you think will happen next?
- Encourage your child to read with other family members. This could be via a videocall or Zoom.
- Read favourite books again.
- Read for pleasure!
