What we will be doing in school

Maths – Division and Fractions

The children will be finishing off their work on division, and using this to support their revisit of fractions. They will be recapping finding the fraction of a shape before finding a fraction of a number. They will use this knowledge to support them in solving word problems.

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English – Descriptive Writing

This week the children will be using their own monster and story plan to write a descriptive story about their monster loose in the city of London! Their monster will be causing all sorts of problems, destroying landmarks and creating chaos!

They will be bringing together all of their taught skills, using adjectives and adverbs, similes, a variety of punctuation and more!

Topic- Crystal Palaces

History

This week the children will be answering the question ‘Who went to the Great Exhibition?’.

We will learn about it’s opening day, the famous people that attended as well as discussing whether all would have been able to afford it in Victorian times.

The children will then interpret two pictures from 1851 and note what the sources tell us about who went.



Have a look through some pictures or photographs you have at home. Discuss with your child what is happening the picture/photo. How do they know? What can they find out about what is happening? Does it tell us the full truth?

Interpreting sources of evidence is such an important history skill and allows the children to learn that not everything is as it seems...



Science

This week the children will be looking at naming the body parts of a human. They will be using different sources to find the correct names for each body part and learn how to

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spell them. They will be creating a lifesize version of their body and label it.

Computing

In computing this week, the children will be using scratch to retell their own story. They will be using their writing in English to create a movie on scratch, replicating their story themselves. They will create their own characters and backgrounds, and use their knowledge of the blocks to tell the story.



Art

This week the children will be creating their London skyline on a polystyrene tile. They will use their sketching skills from their trip to Blythe Hill to accurately draw key landmarks.



RE

In RE this week the children will have an assembly with special visitors, learning about the importance of family in Hinduism.

This week the children will be starting the PE Units of Target Games. In Target Games they will be learning how to be accurate in throwing towards a target, learning where to position their arm and how much power to use.
