What we will be doing in school

How you can help at home

Topic - We're Going on a Bear Hunt

We will find out more about real bears. The children will ask and write questions about what they want to find out about bears. Then, we will research to find out the answers using information books and the internet. We will be learning about different kinds of bears, where they live (habitats and countries) and what they eat.

Try reading some information books at home. Look at the contents page and explore how to use it. Talk about other animals and their habitats. Look at a globe or atlas to talk about where different countries are around the world. Talk about and use question words: where, when, what, why, who, how. Look out for questions and question marks in books, magazines, newspapers, etc.

Maths

We will learn about time. We will learn the days of the week and the months of the year. We will discuss our daytime and night routines.



Talk to your child about their daily routines. What do they do? When?

Which activities do they do on different days of the week? For example, swimming on a Thursday or eating fish fingers on a Friday.

Which month is their birthday in? When do your special celebrations happen?

New graphemes: sh, th, ng, nk New tricky words: she, push, he, of

<u>Graphemes learnt so far</u>: s, a, t, p, i, n, m, d, g, o, c, k, ck, e, u, r, ll, ff, j, ss, v, w, x, y, z, qu, ch

<u>Tricky words taught so far:</u> is, I, the, pull, full, put, as, and, has, his, her, go, no, to, into

You could do a tricky word hunt.

Write some tricky words on pieces of paper or post-it notes and hide them all over the house or garden. Ask your child to find and read them and then write them down. They get a point for every word they find and write correctly. Can they find them all?

Pronunciation Phrase - sh Show me your teeth and push the air out shshshshsh Digraph (sh) two letters, one sound

h - Down, up and over the helicopter



Pronunciation Phrase - th Voiced: Tongue on your teeth, teeth almost closed to make a 'buzzing' th Unvoiced: Tongue on your teeth and push the air out
