What we will be doing in school	How you can help at home
Topic - Hooves, Claws and Paws	
This week we will focus on vets and nocturnal creatures.	Read information books about vets and animals. Discuss which animals and creatures we might see or hear at night.
<u>Literacy</u>	
We will discuss how vets help animals. We will read a story about a Zoo vet. We will read stories about nocturnal creatures such as The Owl who was Afraid of the Dark.	Read stories about different animals. Ask your child to describe how their homes and the local area look different during the day and night.
<u>Maths</u>	
We will continue to compare lengths and also heights using words: long, longer, longest short, shorter, shortest tall, taller, tallest medium, middle-sized	Take some of your toys and make Lego or Duplo towers to the same height. How many blocks tall is each toy? Talk about which is shortest, longest or tallest.
We will begin to do some basic measuring using non-standard units of measurement e.g. how many cubes tall is the toy?	As an extra challenge try measuring your body parts with lego! How many blocks is your finger? Your arm? Your foot? If you don't have enough Lego try using other thing like socks, clothes pegs, books, etc.


