<p style="text-align: center;"><b><u>Topic - Hooves, Claws and Paws</u></b></p> <p>We will finish our topic and see which animals the children still want to find out more about.</p> <p>We will learn about Spring and discuss what the children have observed.</p> <p>We will learn about Easter.</p> 	<p>Ask your child what they notice about the changing season. Look at the spring pictures below and talk about them together. What can you see?</p> <p>Talk to your child about the festivals and traditions that you celebrate. What traditions do you have?</p>
<p style="text-align: center;"><b><u>English</u></b></p> <p>We will play games which involve rhyming words.</p> <p>We will read stories about Spring animals, the season and Easter.</p> 	<p>Read rhyming stories and sing rhymes with your child.</p> 
<p style="text-align: center;"><b><u>Maths</u></b></p> <p>We will count groups of objects and find the number to show the total.</p>	<p>Encourage your child to count groups of objects. They could count groups of toys, socks or Easter eggs!</p>
<p><b><u>Additional learning</u></b></p> <p>We will be egg-hunting, egg and spoon racing, making chocolate nests and preparing for Easter.</p>
