What we will be doing in school

<u>Maths</u>

This week in maths the children will be looking at position and direction. This includes learning left and right, as well as clockwise and anti-clockwise. They will be giving directional instructions as recognising the moves made by an object and in

Key words to know: Left Right Forwards Backwards Clockwise Anti-clockwise Quarter turn Half turn Three quarter turn Whole turn




Can the children describe the movements made by each character? Don't forget to check your answers to see how accurate you were!



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This week the children are looking at the story Toby and the Great Fire of London'. They will be using this text to learn more about what London was like during the fire, using their senses to imagine and describe what it was like.

SPaG focus – doubling the final consonant after a short vowel sound

Topic- The Great Fire of London

Computing: The children will begin their next unit of learning looking at editing a piece of music. We will begin this unit by exploring how music makes us feel and the words we can use to describe it.

History: The children will begin their history topic looking at what life was like in Pudding Lane before the fire began. They will be looking at primary and secondary sources and identifying what they can notice about London 356 years ago and how it has changed compared to today.

RE: We will be learning about weddings and how these are a time of celebration. In the first week we will be focusing on Hindu weddings and looking at the symbols of a Hindu wedding. Do you have any photos of your child at a wedding or photos of your
