Maths

We'll start by looking at place value up to and including 100; exploring different ways of representing the tens and ones in each number, such as Base 10 and Part Whole Models. We will then move onto multiplication and division including the use of arrays, before finishing with fractions.

Geography

We will be doing lots of map work this term; looking at where our school is on a map, mapping our school, learning compass directions, creating map keys and mapping the new school wildlife garden.

Art

For Art this half term we will take inspiration from nature and the work of artists William Morris and Georgia

O'Keeffe as we create prints using printing devices the children will build themselves using carboard and string.

Computing

The children will using basic Word Processing programmes this half term, learning how to enter and change text, find and add images and eventually make poster to show off their new skills.

English

The books we will be using for inspiration this half term will be The Curious Garden, Clean Up, Tidy and the Lorax. We will still be looking for beautifully presented work, with sentences always demarcated with a capital letter and full stop. As well as writing short pieces inspired by the books, there also be more suffix work; 'er' 'est' 'ed' and 'ing' and the introduction of question and exclamation marks.

Nature Detectives

Unifying question:
